

5. YOUR RIGHTS

You have the right to inspect and obtain a copy of your protected health information. This means that you may inspect and obtain a copy of protected health information about you that is contained in a designated record set for as long as we maintain your protected health information. A designated record set contains medical and billing records and any other records that we use in making decisions about you. You may be charged a fee for the retrieval and copying of this information. Under federal and state law, however, you may be denied access to inspect or obtain a copy. Depending on the circumstances, the decision to deny access may be reviewable. Please contact the appropriate medical record department if you have any questions about access to your medical record.

You have the right to request a restriction of your protected health information. This means that you may ask us not to use or disclose any part of your protected health information for the purposes of treatment, payment, or healthcare operations. You may also request that any part of your protected health information not be disclosed to family members or friends who may be involved in your care. Your request must state the specific restriction requested and to whom this restriction applies. The Surgery Center/physician is not required to agree to the restriction that you request. If the Surgery Center/physician believes that it is in your best interest to permit use and disclosure of your protected health information, it will not be restricted. With this in mind, please discuss any restriction you wish to request with your physician.

You have the right to request to receive confidential communication from us by alternative means or at an alternative location. We will accommodate reasonable requests. We may also condition this accommodation by asking you for information as to how payment will be handled or specification of any alternative address or other method of contact. We will not request an explanation from you as to the basis for the request. Please make this request in writing to the privacy contact listed below.

You have the right to request an amendment to your protected health information. This means that you may request an amendment of protected health information about you in a designated record set for as long as we maintain the information. In certain cases, we may deny your request for an amendment. If we deny your request, you have the right to file a statement of disagreement with us and we may prepare a rebuttal to your statement and will provide you with a copy. Please contact the appropriate medical record department listed above if you have questions about amending your medical record.

You have the right to receive an accounting of certain disclosures we have made, if any, of your protected health information. This right applies to disclosures made for purposes outside those for treatment, payment, and healthcare operations. You have the right to receive specific information regarding non routine disclosures that occurred after April 14, 2003. We must respond within sixty (60) days. You may request a shorter timeframe. You are entitled to receive one (1) free accounting each year. There will be a fee for any additional accounting requests during the year. The right to receive this information is subject to certain exceptions, restrictions, and limitations.

You have the right to obtain a copy of this notice from us. Upon request, you may receive an additional paper or electronic copy of this notice from us.

6. COMPLAINTS

If you believe your privacy rights have been violated by Springhill Surgery Center, you may file a complaint with us by contacting the Springhill Surgery Center Privacy Officer at 501-945-5800. You may also file a complaint with the Secretary of Health and Human Services. We will not retaliate against you for filing a complaint. We will not require you to waive the right to file a complaint with HHS as a condition to receive treatment from us.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This notice was published and becomes effective on April 14, 2003. Springhill Surgery Center has a duty as your healthcare provider to maintain your privacy, abide by the terms of this privacy notice, and provide you with a revised copy of this notice if revisions are made.
